At Outset Medical, we strive to be transparent about how we use cookies and other similar technologies in connection with our websites (“Sites”) and other online applications or services (“Services”) that link to this cookie notice (“Notice”). We may use cookies and other similar technologies to operate and improve your experience using our Sites and Services, to measure the effectiveness of our Sites, Services, and communications, and to provide advertisements that are tailored to you. If you choose to opt-in to cookies placed by third parties, then those third parties may receive information about you, your location, or your browsing history.

When you visit any website, including our Sites, the website may store or retrieve information on your browser. This information might be about you, your preferences, your device, and your interactions with or interests in our Sites and Services. This information can be used to make sure our Site works in an optimal way, or to give you a more personalized web experience. When you opt in or select “accept all” cookies, or allow performance, functionality, targeting, or social media cookies, you understand and agree this information is collected by us and by the third parties that operate the cookies on our Sites, and agree to data collection and use both by us and by these third parties. What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your device when you access a website or application (“app”) through a browser. These files are then used to help identify your unique device for a specific purpose, such as to provide information tailored to your location, to remember your preferences, or to provide you with personalized advertisements. Cookies may contain the details of your browsing history on a website among its many uses.

- Cookies may be “first-party cookies,” which are which cookies are placed by us on our Sites, or “third-party cookies,” which are cookies belonging to others that are placed on our Sites. We use both first- and third- party cookies.
- Cookies can be “persistent” or “session” cookies. Persistent cookies remain on your computing device for a period of time, even when you go offline, while session cookies are deleted as soon as you close your web browser. We use both persistent and session cookies.

What are other types of tracking technologies that you may encounter?

Web beacons and session scripts

Web beacons (also known as pixels) allow us to count unique users to our website pages, and to see what users are accessing while on our website. This allows us to tell if visitors to our website are interested in our content, and to determine what types of content are most interesting to website visitors. They provide us with information such as your IP address so that we can distinguish individual visitors from one another. They also show us how many unique individuals interact with our content on our social media pages. If your browser settings permit tracking, information about your viewing of our Site may be transmitted to a third party for the purpose of showing you additional content related to your interests, such as when you use your social media accounts.

Web beacons are integrated into the code of our website, so they cannot be declined using the cookie banner. However if you do not wish to interact with web beacons, you can use a Virtual Private Network (VPN) service, adblocker, or setting on your browser that blocks tracking.

Session scripts (also known as session tracking) perform a similar function. We record interactions with our website, such as clicks or filling out a form, and record information such as your IP address to distinguish individual visitors from one another.

By using our website, you acknowledge and agree that we may use both web beacons/pixels and session scripts for the purposes described in this section.

Analysis tools

Analysis tools, such as Google Analytics, help us analyze how visitors use our Sites and Services. Among other things, these tools use cookies to collect data about the number of visitors to the Site, the web page that referred visitors to the Site, and the pages that visitors view within the Site. Local Shared Objects (e.g., Flash cookies) and Local Storage (e.g., HTML5). These technologies may be used to store content information and preferences. You may manage Flash cookies by [clicking here](#). Your browser may offer settings to turn off HTML5.

By using our website, you acknowledge and agree that we may use analysis tools and local shared objects/local storage for the purposes described in this section.

Why do we use cookies and similar technologies?

We use cookies and other tracking technologies to better understand interest in our products and our Sites, so that we can ensure that the content we provide is useful and interesting. We also use cookies to enable our Sites to function smoothly; to support and personalize the functionality of our Site; to help us monitor activity on our Site (including gathering usage statistics and other business purpose analytics); and to support our marketing activities, by facilitating or tracking the interaction of our Sites and social media platforms (such as links to such sites or use of “like buttons” for our content). When we engage in cross-context tracking, we are doing so to find out how visitors find out about our Site (for example, if they first hear about Outset from a social media post) and whether they choose to continue to interact with Outset across our social media platforms.

Certain Sites or pages within Sites may collect information about your health or medical status, which may include information considered personal health information or “PHI”. You may also choose to use a webform to contact us from our Site, and that contact may include PHI in your responses, or include a full-string URL that reveals your interest in our products. We do not intentionally place any cookies or use other third-party tracking tools for the purpose of behavioral advertising or marketing on pages that collect PHI. If you have opted in to the use of cookies, we may gather certain information to ensure that those pages work properly, and to understand how people are accessing those pages. For example, we may use a cookie to understand if viewing a video or reading an article encouraged you to reach out to us, to ensure that we continue to provide content on our Site that is relevant. We may work with third parties to help us accomplish these goals, such as Google Analytics. Any third parties that receive PHI from us do so under a contract that requires them to respect your privacy.

We may anonymize or aggregate personal information and use it for the purposes described in this Notice and for other purposes to the extent permitted by applicable law.

We place cookies on your devices (including your mobile devices) in accordance with the preferences you set in our cookie consent manager. You may change your preferences at any time by clicking on the cookie banner. You can also use your browser's cookie preference settings to limit or prevent cookies from being placed.

By using our website, you acknowledge and agree that we may use cookies, pixels, analysis tools and local shared objects/local storage for the purposes described in this section. If you choose to contact us using the webform available on our website, you understand that you may be providing us with PHI, and that we may use that PHI to respond to your request. You also understand and consent to the use of your PHI by third parties who help us to monitor our website performance and to receive and respond to your request under a contract that requires them to respect your privacy. If you do not wish to provide us with PHI, then please contact us in another manner other than via our webform. This table is current as of the Effective Date of this Policy and may be updated from time to time. When we update this Policy, you will see a banner on our website indicating the recent update. Do You Use Cookies for Marketing and Analytics?

Yes. We may use information collected from our cookies to identify user behavior and to serve content and offers based on your profile, and for the other purposes described below, to the extent that we are legally permitted to do so in the state or country where you live. We may disclose certain online identifiers to our advertising partners and analytics providers. Disclosing these identifiers to third parties for advertising or analytics purposes may be defined as the “sale” or “sharing” of your Personal Data under certain US privacy laws. You may opt-out of the sale or sharing of your data for marketing or analytics by opting out of Performance, Targeting, and Social Media cookies in our Cookie Preference Center. If you opt-out of the “sale” or “sharing” of your data, we will not deliver customized advertising to you, but you may still see non-targeted advertising about our Websites and/or Services.

In other cases, we may associate cookie information (including information from cookies placed via our advertisements on third party sites) with an identifiable individual. For example:

- If we send you a targeted email which includes web beacons, cookies, or similar technologies we will know whether you open, read, or delete the message.
- When you click a link in a marketing e-mail you receive from us, we may use a cookie to log what pages you view and what content you download from our Sites, even if you are not registered at or signed into our Site.
- If you fill out our form requesting more information, we may gather some information about you that identifies you in order to make sure we associate the responses you give us with you as a unique individual. If you choose to contact us using our webform, we may collect information about your health, medical condition, and the reason for your interest in our Services. This information may include PHI. This ensures that we provide information that is relevant and responsive to your request. If you are not comfortable with this, you should not use the webform. Our marketing team may use this information to better understand who is interested in our Services, and the best way for us to present that information on our Sites.
- If you have enabled cookies on your browser, we may use your general location (within a certain ZIP code) to display ads that are relevant to your location. For example, we may share an ad that shows you a nearby location where you can access our Services. We will not obtain your precise geolocation without your consent.

Do you use cookies from third party companies?

Yes. Some cookies and other similar technologies that we use are from third party companies, such as Facebook (Meta), Instagram, Google, X (formerly known as Twitter), and LinkedIn. We sometimes embed content and sharing tools from other third-party sites, such as “like” buttons from social networking sites; these third-party sites may also place and access cookies on your device. Outset Medical does not control the placement or access of these third-party cookies, and their privacy policies may not offer the same protections as ours. Other third parties may compile information about unique users to our website to help us to understand how many unique visitors we receive to our Sites, and how they discovered our Sites. Finally, we work with some third parties to help ensure our Sites are functioning properly, so they may need information about unique users to provide technical support.

How do I opt out of cookies or other tracking technologies?

You can adjust your cookie settings through our cookie consent manager, which will block cookies from being placed on your device from the Site in the future, in accordance with your preference selection. If you want to remove existing cookies from your device, you can do this using your browser options. Certain browsers may allow you to set universal settings that will control how cookies are placed by any website you interact with. These settings, sometimes called “Global Privacy Controls” are recognized and respected by our Sites. You also may have the following additional options available to you:

- You can instruct your browser to refuse all cookies; however, if you turn cookies off, you may not have access to certain features that make your use of our Sites and Services more efficient, and some of our Sites and Services may not function properly.
- If you are using a mobile device, the mobile device operating setting may allow you to opt out of targeted advertising based on information about the mobile applications you use. You can also stop the collection of location information from your mobile device by changing the preferences on your mobile device.
